

Regulations for Events classified as Extended Events (effective from 18th February 2026)

(to be read in conjunction with Regulations for all AUK Events and Regulations for BP BR and DIY events as appropriate)

1	Extended events add distance, organised as a DIY, before and/or after another AUK calendar event.
1.1	The extended (DIY) portion and the event to which it is appended are treated as separate events, each operating under their own rules, except that:
1.2	The extended (DIY) portion may not be validated unless the event which it extends is also validated.
1.3	The complete ride is subject to BR regulations even if the event which is extended is registered as BP except that the minimum speed up to 600 km will be 14.3 km/h.
1.4	Intermediate controls between the start/finish of the extension portion and the start/finish of the event which it extends should be placed as per the general Event Regulation 7.1.1, although for extensions of each leg under 80km no intermediate control is required.
1.5	Routing between controls may be 'advisory' (left to the rider's choice on the ride), or 'mandatory' (route submitted in advance to the organiser and which rider must then follow). Mandatory routing is validated exclusively by means of a recorded GPS tracklog. GPS tracklogs may also be used on advisory routes as an alternative to conventional paper proofs-of-passage
1.6	The ride distance for advisory routes is taken to be the aggregate shortest rideable distance between the nominated controls.
1.7	Where validation is by means of a GPS tracklog, the rider may request submission of the event for assessment of AAA points which, if awarded, are added to the member's record of the ride.
